write simple stories which they will publish and illustrate on the computers in our lab. Please continue to read with your child every night, as we are working on fluency in reading.


Thank you for continuing to review math facts as well! Our Valentine exchange will be held on Thurs., Feb. 14, during the afternoon.



In ELA the students will continue to practice letter writing and learn the different writing mechanics.


In Religion we will continue studying the Ten Commandments, how to respect earth's gifts and how the earth belongs to all of us.

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#### From the Classroom of Miss Neal

5<sup>th</sup> Grade ELA: This month we begin our unit, Into the Spotlight. Through stories by Gary Soto, Lawrence Yep, Norton Jeter, and Sandra Belton, we will work with the literary elements of character, setting, plot, flashback, and point of view. We will continue to develop our skills in making predictions, drawing conclusions, sequencing, main idea and details as well.

5<sup>th</sup> Grade Math: This month we will be working with data, graphs and probability. This will include: collecting data, bar graphs, line

graphs, circle graphs, stem and leaf plots, mean, median, mode, choosing an appropriate graph to represent data, as well as, predicting outcomes, listing outcomes, and expressing probability as a fraction.

We will also be reviewing for the Math Exam in March.

Technology: We are working on Type to Learn 3 for keyboarding. I continue to make great use of the Scholastic Website for my Grade 5 class-page. I hope you are logging onto the Scott Foresman web

5<sup>th</sup> Grade Science: We are continuing our study of plants. We have been exploring photosynthesis which will lead us into what stems and roots do, how plants reproduce,

and what affects plant growth,

6<sup>th</sup> Grade Science: We are working on Chapter11: *Earth's Resources*. We will investigate renewable and non-renewable resources, energy resources, fossils fuels and how to reduce the harmful effects of fossil fuels.
